

Last stages of article submission: Camera-ready copy

Once the article is accepted for publication, it is the author's responsibility to typeset it according to the *Isogloss* guidelines. Please make sure you use the latest template which is present on the website (which is not necessarily the template you used in your first submission).

We prefer submissions in Word, using the template provided. For those authors who absolutely need Latex, please use the Isogloss Latex template on Overleaf. No other template is accepted.

When formatting the article, please pay attention to the following:

- Headers need to be exactly like on the template: please do NOT edit them, do NOT tamper with them in any way
- There MUST NOT BE page breaks/section breaks inserted (you can check that by clicking the paragraph marks in Word (¶)).
- All the authors' names must appear on separate entries on the page (again, please check template) (so, not: AUTHOR, AUTHOR, AUTHOR, affiliation, affiliation, affiliation)
- The metadata need to be COMPLETE: please check that the keywords and abstract appear exactly like in the last version of the paper, that the title is correct, that all the authors are listed with their emails and affiliations, that the bibliography is exactly the same as in the paper
- **Please use a separate file for every appendix**
- Fn need to be indented [1.25 cm, only 1st line] and 11 pt. **The number is NOT indented:** only the note is
- Glosses need to be aligned, and **follow the Leipzig glossing rules (SMALL CAPS, not CAPS for morphological info, if there's a - in the gloss it must be there in the example, etc).** **The language (if needed) and the reference need to appear on the first line of the example,** following the LGR
- Do NOT use tables for your examples: use Tabs instead
- There needs to be one blank line after every reference. The DOI is on the same line as the reference (no new line!)
- Acknowledgments go in a section at the end of the paper, before the references (so, NOT in the 1st footnote)
- Tables and figures need to be numbered and the source indicated below them (as in the template). The title of tables and figures is in font 11 and not italicized

They will also need to provide me with the reference list in Word, following the same guidelines as above.
